Each year, the youth village provides them with basic supplies, like toiletries, blankets, bedding and clothing to keep them warm in winter. Bet Hagai has turned to CFOIC for assistance in funding these vital items.

Bet Hagai was established in 1984 by a group of young men and women in memory of three friends who were slain by terrorists. These brave and committed people were determined to perpetuate the legacy of devotion to the Land of Israel of their three friends, in the heart of biblical Israel. Located just south of Hebron, Bet Hagai is halfway between Jerusalem and Beersheba. There is a daycare center in the community as well as two preschools. The school-aged children commute to Kiryat Arba. There are a number of public facilities in Bet Hagai itself, including a synagogue, library, and medical clinic.

The jewel in the crown of Bet Hagai is the youth village. This is a very special project that was undertaken by the pioneering founders of Bet Hagai as a way of contributing to Israeli society. The youth village provides a loving and caring home for teenage boys from broken homes, enabling them to enter adulthood with a fighting chance. The youth village provides basic schooling and occupational training, all within a supportive religious atmosphere. In addition to their regular subjects, the boys study Bible and religious law, as rabbis and mentors seek to provide them with the spiritual tools
